Introduction

(The following is read while bread and wine are carried to the altar.)

Guide: With the bread and wine, we present to the Lord our lives and our desire to be with Mary a life-giving presence.

After Holy Communion

(The following is read after all have received Holy Communion.)

Guide: We have received Jesus, we feel Him close, we adore Him and we thank Him.... Let us allow the words of Mother Mazzarello to resound in our hearts: "Live closely united to Jesus", 'Work only to please Him', 'strive to become more holy every day and you will always be joyful', 'Do not be discouraged in the face of any adversity; receive everything from the hands of Jesus'. "Put all your trust in Him and expect everything from Him". "Humility... Charity, a daughter who truly loves Jesus, goes along with all". Let us learn from Mother Mazzarello the language of the soul. It is she who knows how to enter into relationship with the Jesus to become a bearer of fruitful holiness.



PERSONAL SYNTHESIS

(The participants will take time to reflect on the gifts this experience has given them and the steps needed to become a life-generating presence in their community and educational mission.)



PRAYER

(It is suggested to have the prayer in the Exhibit of our FMA Charism. Prepare the prayer space with chairs, hearts that have a saying of MM on one side, 5 posters with the words: initiative, get involved, accompany, bear fruit, celebrate. Participants will bring a symbol that expresses the synthesis of their personal experience during the journey.)

At the Origins of Our Charism - An Encounter that Shapes and Transforms

Introduction

Guide 1: "Returning to the covenant of love and rediscovering vocation as an experience of encounter with God" is the invitation that the XXIV General Chapter addressed to all the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians, aiming at a continuous formation with the vocational zeal (cf. Acts GC XXIV, n. 35). For a

Daughter of Mary Help of Christians, what return would be more significant than returning to the origin of our charism to refresh her first love with God and to draw strength to live fully the Salesian vocation? It is precisely that experience that we have been able to achieve together in these days: an opportunity to be together, a time to reflect together, a commitment to plan the future together with hope. Everything is done in one perspective, that of the encounter with Jesus Christ, the only inexhaustible source and the only force that is capable of changing, forming and transforming every being from within.

Review the Lived Experience to Sing the Praises Together

Guide 2: "Let us have the eyes of our mind and heart turned to Mornese. This village is so small, this house is nothing, and yet for us it is still the center of life." (Fr. Giacomo Costamagna)

Guide 1: The smallness of Mornese recalls the "Galilee of the Gentiles" which becomes the place of the great light of the Gospel. Mazzarello's "nothingness" echoes the unknown Nazareth which becomes the place of Mary's extraordinary "Yes", and above all of the Incarnate Word.

Just as Jesus was born on the outskirts of Jerusalem, in Bethlehem – "house of bread", in Mornese the "source of our charism" arose for every Daughter of Mary Help of Christians. The stranger of the world becomes the cradle of the Savior, the periphery of the world becomes the center of the charismatic vitality.

Guide 2: The presence and footsteps of our Savior Jesus Christ sanctified the soil of Palestine and made it sacred, transforming it into the "holy land". The intense life of Don Bosco and the first collaborators of Main and the first sisters makes Valdocco and Mornese a "blessed land". It transforms the house into an "environment of Paradise". (*The "spirit of the origins"*)

Looking back at the time that has just passed, what has given meaning to our steps, activities, and visits? What element makes our experience into "an encounter that forms and transforms"? How do the experiences give me hope? Instrumental Music

(As the music plays, time is given for reflection.)

Guide 1: "It is good to give thanks to the Lord, and to sing to your name, O Most High" (*Ps 92:2*). With grateful hearts, let us praise the Lord for his goodness manifested during our life, repeating the last acclamation of each invocation.

Voice 1: For places marked by the charismatic experiences that still speak to us of a fervent relationship with the Divine and with others;

All: We give you thanks, Lord!

Voice 2: For the activities aimed at our growth in our religious vocation and in the Salesian mission;

All: We give you thanks, Lord!

Voice 3: For the people who welcome us, take care of us and above all show us a sign and expression of your encompassing love;

All: We give you thanks, Lord!

Refrain: Laudate omnes gentes, laudate Dominum (x2)

Share the Experience Lived to Enrich Ourselves

(Four participants will be chosen to read the follow scripture.)

Gospel Jn 2,1-12

On the third day, there was a wedding in Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now

there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So, they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from (although the servers who had drawn the water knew), the headwaiter called the



bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs in Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him. After this, he and his mother, his brothers, and his disciples went down to Capernaum and stayed there a few days.

Guide 1: Accepting the invitation to "return to the origin of the charism", we welcome an opportunity to participate in the marriage of the covenant where the gift of faith and vocation is refreshed, strengthened and renewed. Each participant in the wedding at Cana has her own experience but all meet in the faith grown in Jesus and in following him.

Guide 2: "Mary, mother of Jesus and our mother, shrewd in grasping the events and the embarrassment of others with her gaze and heart constantly turned towards her Son, invites us to do what He says, gives us clear eyes to keep everything in our hearts and continually awaken in us the great signs of God." (Taken from "Mary, Woman of the New Wine" by Don Tonino Bello)

Guide 1: "Disciples, invited at Cana, but unable to provide, without wine, without bread and without fish, with calloused and empty hands, yet precisely because they are ready to accept the gift, to believe in the One who renews and regenerates."

Guide 2: "Servants, useless, but faithful executors of the Word, of that Word that speaks and acts, tangible and visible at the same time, without excuse and

ambitions, eager only to adhere; attentive to the slightest move and command of Jesus, anxious to fill to the improbable emptiness of their own and others' existence."

Guide 1: "The vocational dimension of our life... it is vivified in the reciprocity generated by the word and life of Jesus" (GC XXIV, n. 22). With the symbols prepared, we can share in the atmosphere of prayer, the experience lived to enrich each other.

(Participants will place their symbol at the center, take a heart and share the significance of their symbol. After every three sharing a refrain will be sung)

Refrain

Bless the Lord my soul, and bless His holy name. Bless the Lord, my soul, who leads me into life.

Plan Together to Mature the Entrusted Experience

Guide 2: "Faith is concretized for us in a process to be shared as consecrated women, as an educating community, as a Salesian Family, as a Church to revive and witness to the beauty of vocation and mission in an attitude of continuous formation. In this process we assume missionary synodality as a way of life to hear the cry of the poor and of the earth and to make bold evangelical choices" (GC XXIV, n. 29). In the Apostolic Exhortation, **Evangelii Gaudium** (cf. n. 24), Pope Francis highlights some paths that are particularly in harmony with our mission as FMA:

(As each word is read a participant will place the word at the center of the prayer space.)

Voice 4: INITIATIVE It is to meet without fear, to feel the responsibility to make an unrepeatable contribution to the good of all. Whoever experiences that God has taken the initiative and has preceded him in love (cf. 1 Jn 4:10), dares to take the first step with courage.

Voice 5: GET INVOLVED It is letting oneself be to touched by the lives of others, it is knowing how to shorten distances, being in touch with

reality, especially being closest to the least, that periphery from which one sees better the fragility, needs, hopes and opportunities for intervention.

Voice 4: ACCOMPANY It is the word of one who is among people, walks with them and knows how to share life with loving patience. One knows the long waits and welcomes with serenity gifts and limitations. It is a verb of reciprocity that implies giving and receiving.

Voice 5: BEAR FRUIT It is the expression of a fruitfulness rooted in love (cf. Jn 15:5). God wants us to be fruitful, not sterile. This requires letting ourselves to be fruitful by the Holy Spirit in order to educate others to be responsible for their growth and to be involved for the good, in a bond that makes us all brothers and sisters.

Voice 4: CELEBRATE It recalls the dimension of the fullness of life that directs us to celebrate with joy, hope and gratitude the signs of God's blessing presence in everyday life.

Guide 1: Let us now write on the other side of the heart, an attitude that we desire to undertake in order to be a presence capable of generating life filled with hope in the mission entrusted to us.

pace and, after having flanked you, to take you by the hand and walk with you.

All: Mary, accompany us on our journey!

Voice 5: Do not allow our lips to proclaim that lament prevails over amazement, that despair overwhelms industriousness, that skepticism crush enthusiasm, and that the heaviness of the past prevent us from looking to the future with confidence and hope.

All: Mary, accompany us on our journey!

Voice 4: Multiply our energies, so that we may know how to instill in the new generation the conviction and desire needed to be bearers of peace and hope in today's broken world.

All: Mary, accompany us on our journey!
